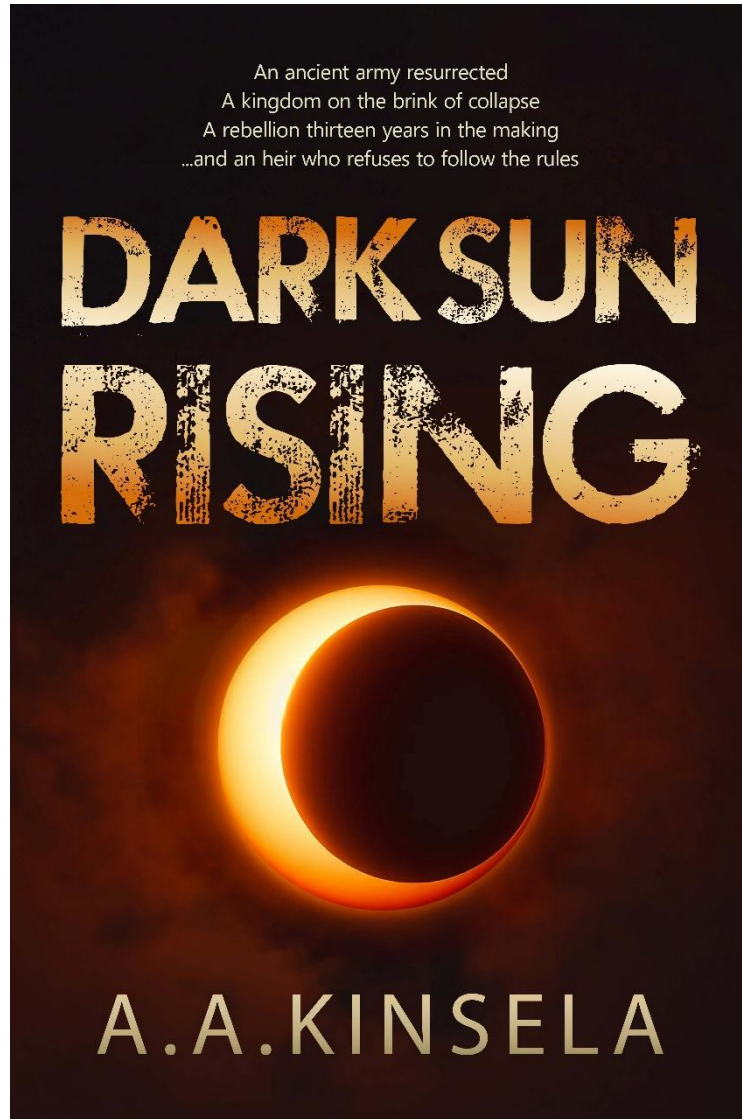


Dark Sun Rising (Song Gate, #2)

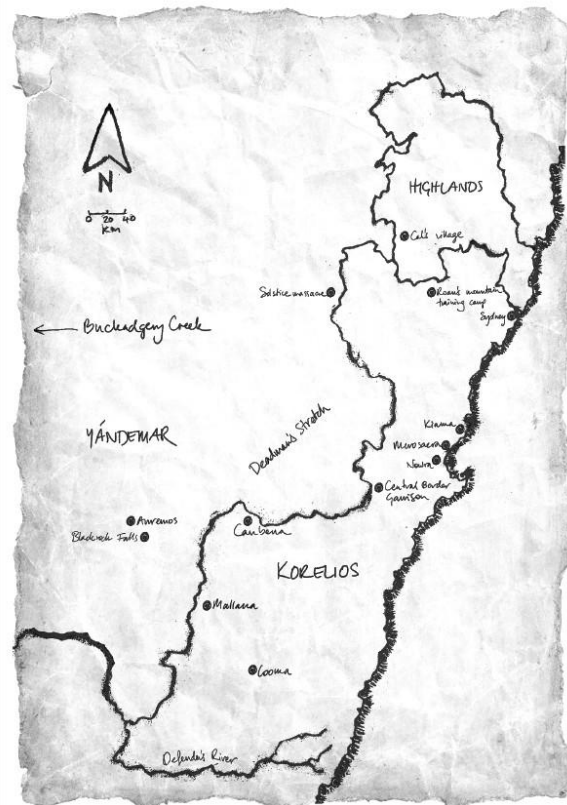

...Once defended by the legendary Penumbra Guard, which was disbanded following the second slave rebellion three hundred years ago, Korelian monarchs are now protected by the Penumbra Guard's more ruthless successors, the Arai...

...The introduction of the Arai Oath significantly altered the rule of Law. The Oath bound the Arai to serve and protect the monarch, thus transferring absolute control of the military to the monarchy. Some rulers have attempted to restore the senate to its former state of power. The most recent example was Alastor, who was in the process of assigning an unprecedented level of legislative and judicial authority to the senate when he was assassinated. His successor, Thanos, demolished his father's advancements by dissolving the senate, thereby terminating public recourse for justice and removing oversight and accountability of the monarchy.
